

Trio of Sport in the Hunter

The Hunter region will be treated to a feast of sport across three different codes over the next 10 days.

The Newcastle Jets open their 2011/12 A-League campaign on Saturday 8 October, the Australian Diamonds play England in a Netball Test Match on Sunday and a week later Australia takes on New Zealand in the Rugby League Test.

"The Hunter Sports Group invested in the Netball and Rugby League Test to put Newcastle and the Hunter front of mind as a tourist destination," Hunter Sports Group CEO Troy Palmer said.

The Netball Test between Australia and England on Sunday October 9 will be played in front of a full house, after tickets sold out to this event.

On Sunday October 16, Australia host New Zealand at Ausgrid Stadium for a one-off match ahead of the Four Nations Tournament in the UK later this month. A crowd of over 30,000 is expected at the match with tickets still available.
